## Osteospermums

Also known as African daisies, osteospermums offer daisy-like blooms in bold purples, pinks, and whites. Heat- and drought-tolerant, they provide long-lasting color and thrive in urban planters with well-drained soil and plenty of sun.



## Miniature Daffodils (Tete a Tete)

These cheerful, compact daffodils bring early spring color with their bright yellow blooms. Hardy and low-maintenance, they thrive in planters and urban spaces, returning year after year.

## Pansies

A cool-season favorite, pansies add vibrant color to spring planters with their wide range of hues and delicate, velvety petals. Resilient to temperature swings, they bloom from early spring through late fall, making them ideal for NYC's variable weather conditions.



## Pericallis

These lush, daisy-like flowers burst with vivid blues, purples, and pinks, adding an eye-catching pop to early spring displays. Preferring cool temperatures and partial sun, pericallis thrives in planters, offering a bright and resilient floral display before the summer heat sets in.
