Fuzzy Powerhouse

Common Eastern Bumble Bee

This busy bee is known for its fuzzy, black-and-yellow striped body. The Common Eastern Bumble Bee is a key native pollinator for tomatoes and blueberries. They use a technique called "buzz pollination" to shake pollen loose from flowers!



Sweet Maker

European Honey Bee

Famous for producing honey, this bee is a social insect living in large colonies. The European Honey Bee pollinates variety of plants. A single hive can produce up to 100 pounds of honey each year!



Busy Burrower

Ligated Furrow Bee

These bees are ground nesters, often found in gardens and fields. The Ligated Furrow Bee is a diligent pollinator, especially of wildflowers. They are one of the first bees to emerge in the spring, ready to get to work!



Shiny Emerald

Pure Green Sweat Bee

With a metallic green body, this bee stands out among the flowers. The Pure Green Sweat Bee is small but mighty, contributing to the pollination of many plants. They are attracted to the salt in human sweat, hence their name!



Fake Bee

Eastern Calligrapher Fly

Often mistaken for a bee due to its black and yellow stripes, the Eastern Calligrapher Fly is actually a hoverfly. They play a crucial role in pollination and are also natural pest controllers. Fun fact: They are harmless and don't sting!



Night Owl

Evening Primrose Sweat Bee

This bee has a special love for the evening primrose flower, often buzzing around at dusk. The Evening Primrose Sweat Bee is a key pollinator for nocturnal flowers. Unlike most bees, this species is more active in the late afternoon and evening!



Stealthy Striper

Brown Winged Striped Sweat Bee

This small bee is known for its subtle brown wings and striped abdomen. The Brown Winged Striped Sweat Bee is a ground nester and helps pollinate a variety of wildflowers. They are solitary bees, each female creating her own nest!



Gliding Jewel

Painted Skimmer Dragonfly

With its vibrant, stained-glass wings that help them camouflage among the reeds, the Painted Skimmer is a master of the skies! While not a bee, this dragonfly is an important predator of small insects, helping maintain a balanced ecosystem.
